



AMBASSADOR LISA GUILLERMIN GABLE
U.S. Commissioner General, Aichi EXPO 2005



In August 2004 President George W. Bush appointed Lisa Gable as U.S. Commissioner General of Section of the United States Exhibition to the 2005 World Exposition, Aichi, Japan, the first world's fair of the 21st century. She holds the personal rank of Ambassador during the EXPO, from March 25 to September 25, 2005.

Ambassador Gable's career includes extensive leadership experience in global brand management, technology, fundraising, philanthropy and political strategy. She serves as chairman of the board of the Pacific Research Institute, the San Francisco-based think tank that focuses on education, health care and entrepreneurship; served as a commissioner of the President's Commission on White House Fellowships; and served as principal and was co-founder of the Guillermin Group, an Atlanta and Silicon Valley, California, consulting firm specializing in brand management for Fortune 500 companies. Her background includes tenure as vice chairman and director of strategy and communications for the U.S. Defense Department's Defense Advisory Committee on Women in the Services; global corporate identity manager for INTEL Corporation; and extensive philanthropic and political endeavors in California and in her native Virginia.

Ambassador Gable is a graduate of the University of Virginia with a bachelor's degree in international relations and holds a master's degree from Georgetown University's National Security Studies program.

She and her husband, James Gable, reside in Upperville, Virginia with their daughter. They will reside in Nagoya, Japan during the months of EXPO 2005.
